DISCUSSIONS OF THE BOARD







"The Right Tool for the Job" - Part 1

I've been working with a new Model A mechanic lately, which reminded me of some basics on choosing the right tool for the job. Today we talk about choosing wrenches and sockets for use on nuts and bolts. The thing that determines your choice is how well you need to grip the hex, to allow you to apply the torque (twist) you need... and your access to the nut or bolt head.

Golfing attire might be the corduroy knickers, white shirt/blouse, sweater, and leather shoes with knee high stocks.


Perhaps instead of walking or sports, attending an afternoon tea would provide a delightful afternoon. The orange floral chiffon dress with a Bertha collar,


