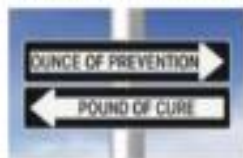
TECHNICAL TIPS

An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure

How often do you check the 'small stuff' that you assume is always okay? As I was preparing my Tudor for the trip to and from the MARC National Meet in Gettysburg, I took advantage of my garage time to snap some photos of the 'small stuff' I was inspecting in the engine area before the big trip. I didn't want to overlook anything 'small' in my garage that I might need to fix 'big' on the road. Enjoy summer driving!



This contact point on the distributor cap wears. Inspect and replace or lightly sand as needed.

Check the coil wire at each end to ensure the tightness of the contact points and dress as needed. Each contact can be soldered on for the best connection.

The throttle linkage assembly needs oil at each end; this is the passenger side oil hole.



Place a couple of drops of oil in the oiler for the lower shaft bushing.

I use 1000-grit sandpaper to dress the rotor's tip

The gap between the rotor and distributor body contacts should be 0.025-0.30 inches. Check all four, adjust as needed, and then dress each one.

Remove and clean all four spark plugs, check the gap, and set it at 0.035 inches. A plug gap for a high compression head may be 0.030-0.33 inches.

Replacement cam screws have an oil hole in the center. Place a couple of drops of oil here to lube the upper shaft bushing.



- If you have an original water pump, you must grease the front and rear using water-soluble or waterproof grease on the block end and chassis grease on the forward grease fitting. If you have a leakless pump, the front bearing may be sealed and require no grease. The front bearing on my leakless pump is plugged; the plug is visible. Be sure you know what type of water pump is on your Model A. They vary. Bratton's sells water-soluble grease, and Snyder's sells waterproof grease.
- Check your fan belt for wear and tightness; a one-inch amount of play in the belt is normal.
- Check your spark plug connectors for tightness.
- Original two-blade fans are NOT safe; obtain a cast aluminum two-blade fan available from most parts suppliers.
- Use green coolant or water with Water Wetter coolant additive; over-filling will result in the radiator dumping excess.
- Check your manifold bolts for tightness.
- Check the distributor body for cracks.

This list is not exhaustive and serves only as a reminder. I recommend you follow Les Andrews' red Maintenance book for maintenance guidance. Online information sources will offer variations in recommended settings, products, and adjustments with a mix of opinions, beliefs, and perspectives so read, learn, and be your own expert! - Jim

Ford Model A Era Fashions (1928-1931)

Pre-1920s: The Era of Modesty

Before the 1920s, women's fashion was a reflection of modesty and conservatism. Garments covered them from neck to toe, and a hat was considered an essential accessory for any outdoor venture. Showing any amount of cleavage was a social taboo, reserved only for women of ill repute.



The 1920s: Flappers and Freedom

The end of World War I ushered in a period of liberation and experimentation in women's fashion. The iconic flapper style emerged, characterized by looser, straight-line dresses that often hung from the shoulders without a defined waistline. Hemlines rose dramatically, revealing legs below the knee – a bold statement for the era. These dresses, coupled with the shorter, bobbed hairstyles, symbolized a new era of freedom and rebellion against traditional norms.
