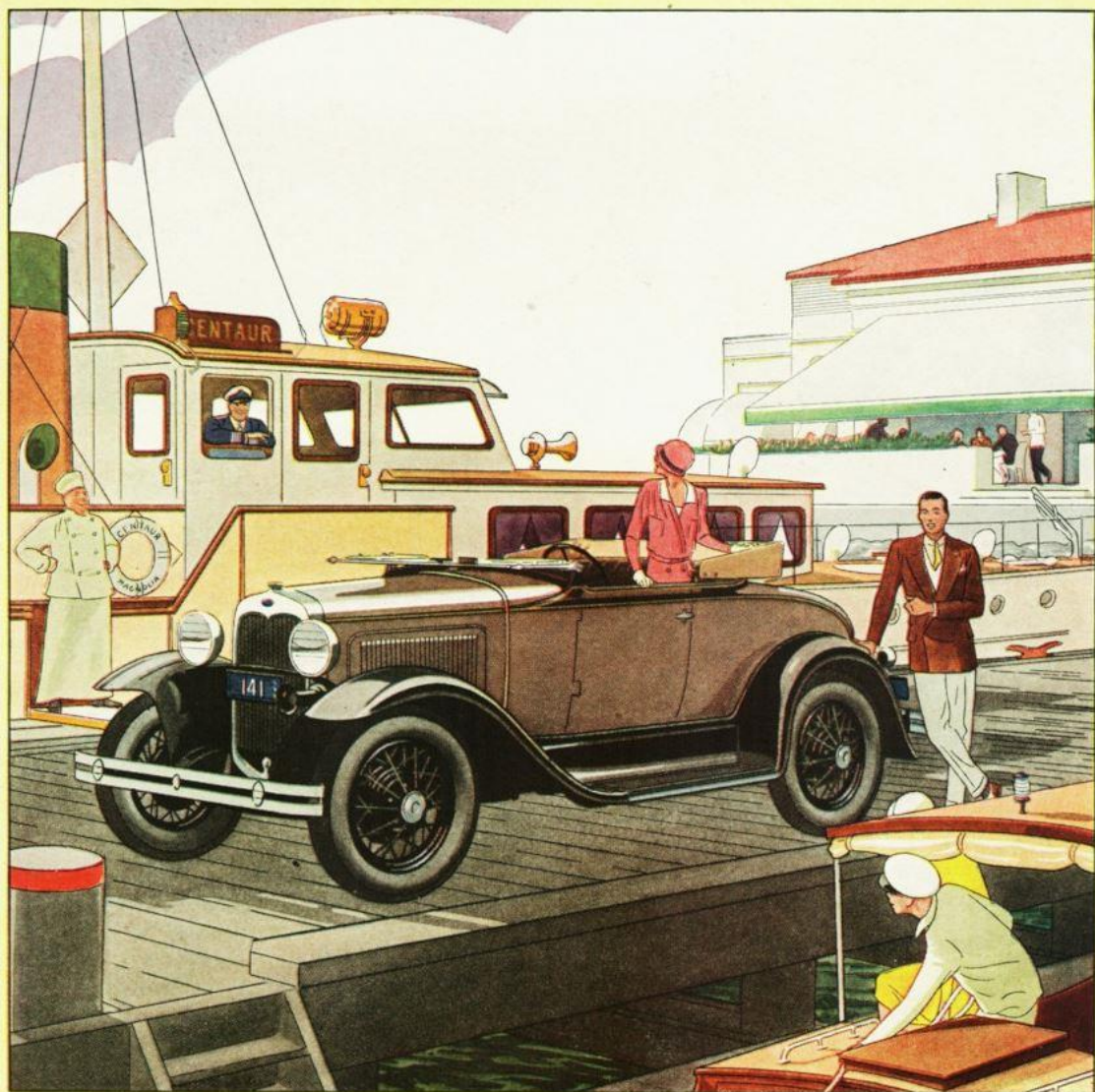

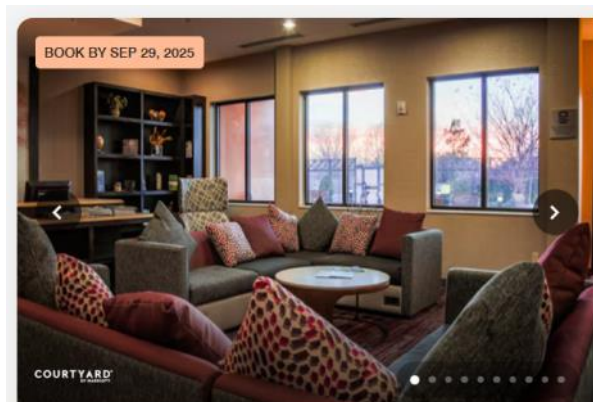

October 16-19, 2025

Courtyard Hotel

If you are driving South on Hwy 77H (12th St) from the Midwest City area, turn right on Robinson Dr. (7/11 on the corner) and continue West for 3.7 miles. Cross over I-35 then turn Left on Interstate Dr. Continue South to Copperfield Road. Turn Right on Copperfield Road, the Courtyard is directly behind the Cracker Barrel Restaurant.

Friday Morning

Line Up at 09:15 behind the hotel, Departure at 9:30.

Sam Noble Museum, 2401 Chautauqua Ave. Norman, OK

Depart the Courtyard, turn Right on Copperfield Dr, continue South on Interstate Dr. until you reach River Oaks drive (**Just before Red lobster**). Turn Right at River Oaks Dr. Continue River Oaks Dr. until you reach 36th Ave. Turn Left on 36th Ave. until you reach Ed Noble Parkway to Hwy 9 and continue on Hwy 9.

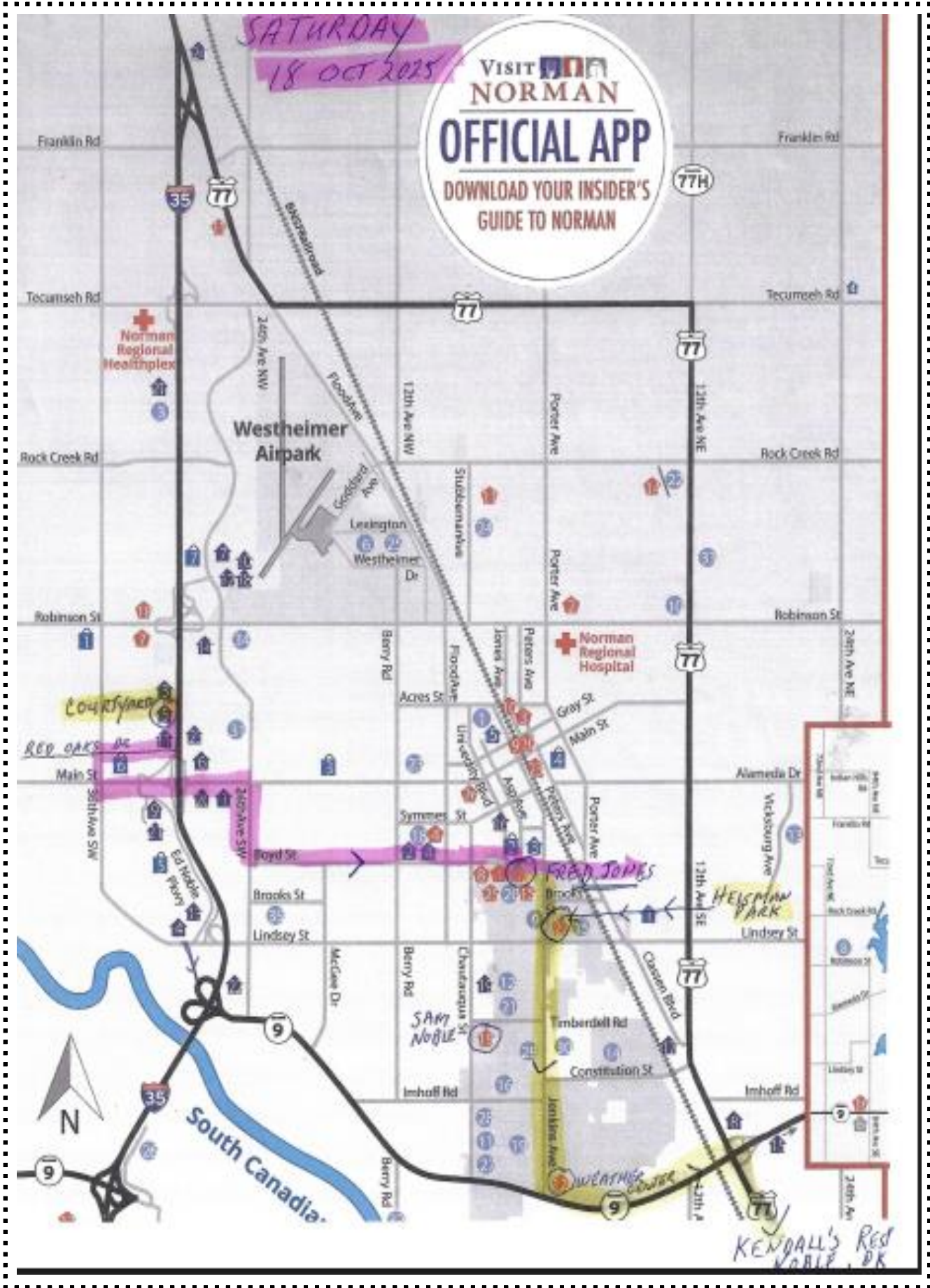
On the way to Kendall's Restaurant, we plan on driving to the Heisman Statues.

Turn East on Boyd St. to Jenkins Ave. Turn Right on Jenkins Ave. to Brooks. Left on Brooks to a parking lot behind the Heisman Statues. Departing the parking lot Turn Left on Jenkins Ave. Stay on Jenkins Ave until you reach Route 9. Turn Left on Route 9 (Ed Noble Parkway) continue to Hwy. 77. Turn Right on Hwy 77 to Noble, Ok. **Kendall's** Restaurant is located on the corner of Hwy. 77 and 3rd Street in Noble. TIPS FOR YOUR COOLING SYSTEM

From Diablo A's Tech seminar on Mar. 29, 2025

- The fins on your radiator must be in good condition for maximum heat transfer.
- Most cooling system problems can be traced to a malfunctioning radiator.
- A good radiator shop can tell you if your radiator is worth rebuilding.
- Consider a 10 fin per inch replacement if you are re-coring or buying a new radiator.
- A lot of overflow tubes (remove the radiator cap and you will see it) are too short. It can be extended with a short piece of plastic tubing run almost to the top of the cap.
- Only add water or coolant when the engine is warm (water expands when it gets hot).
- If you have an original steel two-bladed or steel 4-bladed fan you should change it to an aluminum two-bladed fan or a plastic 6-bladed fan. The old ones have been known to fly apart and end up in your radiator or through your hood (this is not good!).
- Water pumps are easily rebuilt from kits from the major Model A parts suppliers.
- Some folks are going to "leak-less" water pumps which you can buy ready to go or you can rebuild yours that way.
- If you have a traditional water pump, be sure to use only "water pump" grease on the front bearing otherwise you will get chassis grease in your radiator which is no good.
- Cooling system additives are highly recommended. There are many choices, talk to your friends who are experienced.

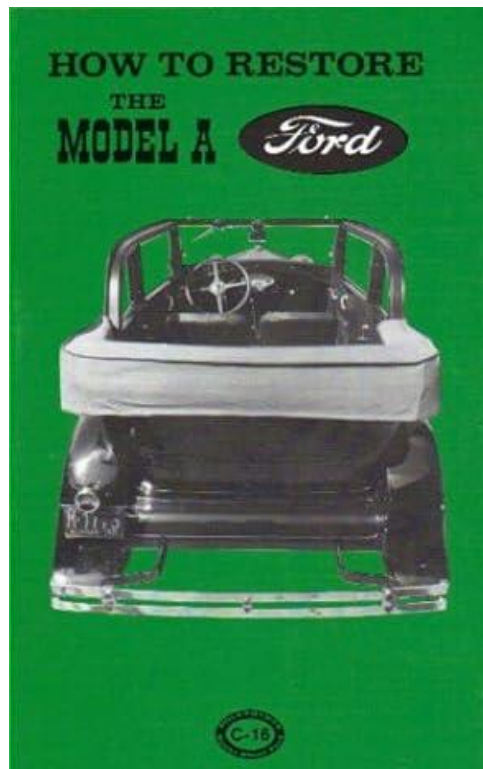
